Serena Millsap Cherubin, 53, of Baytown, Texas, passed away peacefully on March 3, 2026, surrounded by her loving family.

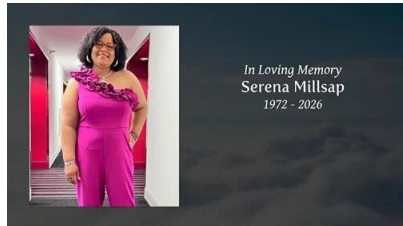

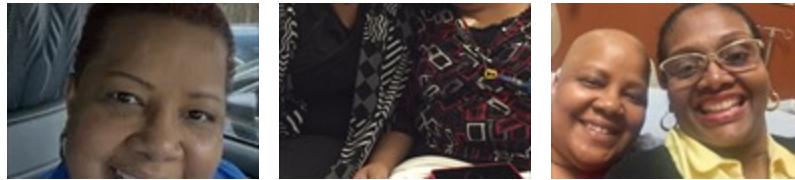
